Welcome to the 2020 remote RPLA awards ceremony!

Due to the pandemic, we're celebrating remotely this year, but fun is still on the agenda. Will we miss five hundred-plus folks cheering, the walks to the stage, and the group photos? You bet. But going remote has its advantages, which you'll see at the ceremony.

If you're new to RPLA, the Royal Palm Literary Awards competition is FWA's flagship writing competition, which this year accepted entries in twenty-eight adult genre-categories and five youth genre-categories, with published and unpublished works judged separately.

During the ceremony, the winners of this year-long competition are announced for the very first time. Past winners have told us that winning can be life changing, not just for the fun of bragging and wagging around cool trophies, but also because wins have given members real boosts to their writing careers.

Particularly exciting are the grand prizes—Published Book of the Year, Unpublished Book of the Year, and Best Children's Book. These winners receive extra perks, which for Published Book of the Year includes an invitation to become the next year's Collection Person of Renown.

Thank you to RPLA's extended administrative team, all of whom have generously shared their time and talent to the writing community through RPLA. Their names and photos appear in this program.

Thank you to RPLA's 160 judges, who were literary agents, publishers, journalists, editors, librarians, bestselling and award-winning authors, professors, university English department heads, and teachers. They were an international contingent, and they took their mission seriously.

Special thanks to the stars of RPLA—the entrants! Each year you raise the bar.

Judging Process

For each entry, judging required eight steps, multiple administrators and rubric coordinators, and many judges, as follows:

- Two initial judges scored and commented on a 100-point scale. For booklength entries, they read the first thirty pages. [An entry could be entered in two genre-categories, maximum.]
- If the scores of the initial judges were fifteen or more points apart, a discrepancy judge was brought in. The two closest scores were recorded, and the third was dropped.
- All rubrics were reviewed by rubric coordinators for consistency and tone.
- If the combined scores of the two recorded initial-judge rubrics totaled 170 or more points, the entry became a semifinalist.
- Semifinalist entries were sent to final judges. For book-length entries, the final judges read the full book.
- The score of the final judge was doubled and added to the initial scores.
- If the total score was 340 or greater, the entry became a finalist.

Only finalists were eligible for awards, which were given to the top three scorers in each genre category. The winners' names will be revealed for the first time—Saturday night!
